



BEHAVIORAL FENG SHUI AND ENVIRONMENTAL CORRESPONDENCE

CASE STUDY:

The homeowner is a very wealthy businessman. However, for unknown reasons, the original southeast entrance gate has been sealed with an iron fence and is no longer used as the main entrance. Instead, the homeowner now enters from the back entrance on the north side. To the east, there is a near-dead tree, with a 2-meter-tall rose tree standing beside it.

In the northeast, two trees have been planted, one of which is a pomegranate tree bearing abundant fruit.



JUDGMENT:

- The homeowner has a successful career and benefits from powerful benefactors.
- However, they frequently engage in backdoor dealings and bribery to handle affairs.
- This will inevitably lead to legal troubles, and the lawsuit will be a consequence of their own actions.
- The feng shui of this house tends to make the homeowner more likely to have daughters, and there is also a probability of giving birth to twins.



ACTUAL FEEDBACK:

- The homeowner is very wealthy.
- Last year, he was frequently summoned by law enforcement authorities for questioning, as part of an investigation into official bribery and corruption cases. However, he was not charged in those matters.
- In the same year, however, he was convicted of sexual assault against a minor—a crime that took place inside his own home—and was sentenced to six years in prison.
- Additionally, the homeowner has a daughter who also lives in this house, and she has given birth to a pair of twins.
